**GREATER INDIANA CLEAN CITIES COALITION RECOGNIZES CITYBUS**

*Second year in a row as a Clean Air Champion*

LAFAYETTE, IN, March 3 - The Greater Indiana Clean Cities Coalition has recognized CityBus for its efforts in switching from diesel fuel to compressed natural gas (CNG).

CityBus will accept its second Clean Air Champion Award at Greater Indiana's Annual Awards and Networking Reception. This year's ceremony is at Rock Bottom Restaurant & Brewery in Indianapolis on March 3.

CityBus replaced an additional four diesel buses with CNG-fueled buses by the end of 2019, bringing the total number of CNG buses to 36. The transit system has improved its environmental impact by surpassing its goal to replace half its fixed-route fleet with CNG-powered buses by 2025.

Using CNG fuel will reduce CityBus's carbon footprint, save on fuel costs, and lower maintenance and repair expenses. CityBus will add another four alternative fuel buses to the fleet in 2020.
